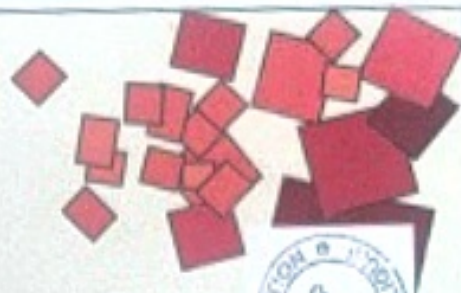

Report on Workshop on CBCS and NEP 2020

Date: 24th June 2022

Venue: Executive Conference Hall, St. Anthony's College Shillong

The workshop on the implementation of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) was organized by the NEP Implementation Committee of St. Anthony's College Shillong. The event took place in the Executive Conference Hall of the college and was facilitated by Prof. Tanka Bahadur Subba, the former Vice-Chancellor of Sikkim University and a retired professor from the Department of Anthropology, NEHU.

1. **Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education:** The NEP 2020 emphasizes the importance of providing a holistic and multidisciplinary education to students. It encourages the integration of arts, humanities, sciences, and vocational subjects to promote well-rounded learning and develop students' critical thinking abilities.
2. **Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE):** The policy recognizes the significance of early childhood education and aims to provide quality ECCE to children between the ages of 3 and 6 years. It seeks to

Professor Subba also stress on the importance of the following points while implementing NEP 2020 in the Colleges.

1. **Curriculum Framework Design and Syllabus Design:** The process of curriculum framework design and syllabus design under the NEP 2020 was discussed to enable participants to understand the importance of relevance and contemporary approaches.
2. **Multidisciplinary Approach to Education in NEP:** The workshop explored the importance of promoting a multidisciplinary approach in education to foster holistic learning and address real-world challenges.
3. **Skill Education, Language Papers, Value-Added Courses, and Internships:** The NEP 2020 emphasizes the integration of skill education, value-added courses, and internships to equip students with practical knowledge and enhance employability.
