REPUBLIC DAY CAMP 2023

The Republic Day Camp (RDC) is held at Garrison Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt every year from 01st January to 29th January, 2023. The selected NCC cadets from all States and Union Territories attend the camp. This camp represents all parts of India. The camp is normally inaugurated by the Vice President of India in the first week of Jan and culminates with the Prime Minister's Rally on 28 January. The aim of Republic Day Camp is to enhance the self confidence of cadets, deepen their value systems and provide an exposure to the rich culture and traditions of our nation, projection of cherished ideals and capabilities of the cadets of the NCC is intrinsic. The RDC cadets were selected after several rounds of rigorous screening at Groups and Directorates level in the last one year. Each cadet had undergone four to five screenings before reaching to the RDC-23. Cadets participated in a number of activities, which culminated with PM Rally and the prestigious PM Banner, which is graded on performance of all Directorates throughout the year.

A number of dignitaries visited the camp namely, the Vice President of India, Raksha Mantri , Rajya Raksha Mantri , Defence Secretary , Chief Minister of Delhi , Chief Minister of Assam, Chief of Defence Staff , Chief of the Army Staff , Chief of the Naval Staff , Chief of the Air Staff . Guard of Honour was given to them , followed by a cultural programme and tea party wherein the cadets got the opportunity to interact with them and gain motivation from them. This year 148 SD and 148 SW cadets created history by becoming the first NCC contingent to march on the newly named Kartavyapath on 26th of January , Republic Day Parade. In the cultural competitions, NER Directorate bagged gold in group song . Flag area competition was held where glimpse and heritage of the region are displayed through collage and on the plinth area, which is made by the cadets with the help of marbles and paints. Puneet Sagar Abhiyan was also held there which aims to synergise efforts toward engaging youth for promoting clean water bodies. The aim of this campaign is to clean sea shores from plastic and other waste material and create awareness about the importance of cleanliness. National integration awareness programme is one such event in Republic Day camp where all the 17 directorates perform to show the culture and heritage of their region. North east region directorate showcased its diversity with dance performance from all the seven sister states and also the MCs speaking about the history, geography, economy, social and cultural heritage and the region's eminent personalities and with all the different cultural and diversity, portrayed the feeling of oneness. Finally we were taken for Delhi Darshan where we were shown India Gate, National War Memorial and Red Fort.

Celebration of the 24th Anniversary Of Kargil Vijay Diwas

Date : 26/07/2023

The Kargil War, a conflict between India and Pakistan that took place in 1999, involved the covert involvement of Pakistani paramilitary forces led by General Ashraf Rashid. Despite initial denials from the Pakistani army regarding their involvement in the war, documents left behind by casualties as well as testimony from prisoners of war (POWs) and later statements made by Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif and Army Chief of Staff Pervez Musharraf confirmed the presence of militants. The war ended with India's victory over Pakistan on 26th July, 1999 which is now observed annually as Kargil Vijay Diwas in India. St. Anthony's College remembered the Martyrs and celebrated the Kargil Vijay Divas in honour of **Capt. K.C Nongrum** (Maha Vir Chakra) who sacrificed his life in the Kargil War-1999 for our great nation India. In commemorating this victory were the presence of esteemed guests such as Prof. Tonny C. L .kharmujai (H.O.D) of English Department and Rev. Fr. (Dr) A.L Jose SDB, Rector of the college and Rev. Br (Dr) Albert Longley Dkhar, Principal and other dignitaries who recognized the importance of acknowledging these historical events for future generations to learn from them.



There was also a campfire in the last day which all the cadets dance and have a lot of fun. On 28th June, 2023 all cadets departed to their homes.










The Blood Donation Camp was organized by the Rotary Club Shillong Heritage in association with Regional Blood Bank Pasteur Institute of Shillong at Super Care Hospital from 0930 hrs to 1300 hrs. Five SD Cadets and Two SW Cadets were present in the premises as volunteers along with other individuals and crpf volunteers.



Before the procedures were put in full motion, the blood donation centre had everyone singing the National Anthem reminding us of the efforts of service we are carrying out. The procedures started off with the filling of confidentiality forms of bio data for use of the centre in carrying out the blood donation.



- The first test for the donor carried out was in a small lab for checking haemoglobin levels in the blood.
- After the first test, the donor was sent to the counsellor room to determine about any recent health issues, medical history, any substance abuse, etc.



- The second test carried out was a medical examination for checking the blood pressure of the individual and those whose blood pressure were a bit low were given a fruit juice before being tested again.
- After the tests were concluded and the donor was deemed fit, then they were sent to the room where the blood was drawn.



Among the five SC cadets who volunteered as a blood donor, one was not able to do so as he was deemed unfit due to the doctor's low blood pressure level while the rest successfully completed the procedures. After the blood donation process, everyone was given refreshments for gaining back their strength and along with that, certificates were distributed as well.

ALL INDIA THAL SAINIK CAMP 2022

Thal Sainik Camp is a National Camp conducted by the National Cadet Corps at Directorate General NCC, Delhi every year. The cadets go through a selection process from their respective Units and then compete to represent their Group and finally get selected to represent their respective Directorate at Delhi. REPORT ON CLUB ACTIVITY

TITLE: Cleaning Drive at **Mawsawa Falls**, Mawkma, Sohra-rim.

DATE: 19th August 2022

NO. OF BENEFICIARIES: 22

OBJECTIVES:

1. To promote cleanliness and sustainability of the local tourist spot.
