His-UG-303: History of Modern India

Objective: This course is designed to introduce the students to the main trends and developments in India from the 18th to the 20th century (1757-1947).

Rise of extremism in Indian politics. Birth of the Muslim League.

Unit IV: Swaraj to Complete Independence: Role of Gandhi in the national movement; Khilafat and Non-Cooperation Movements. Left Wing in the Indian National Congress. Revolutionary Activism. (Bhagat Singh and Surya Sen) Civil Disobedience Movement. Government of India Act, 1935. Quit India Movement. Indian National Army. Independence and Partition.

Besides the screening of the film, there will be an exclusive one on one interactive session with the Director and the Cast of the film and autograph signing at the end.

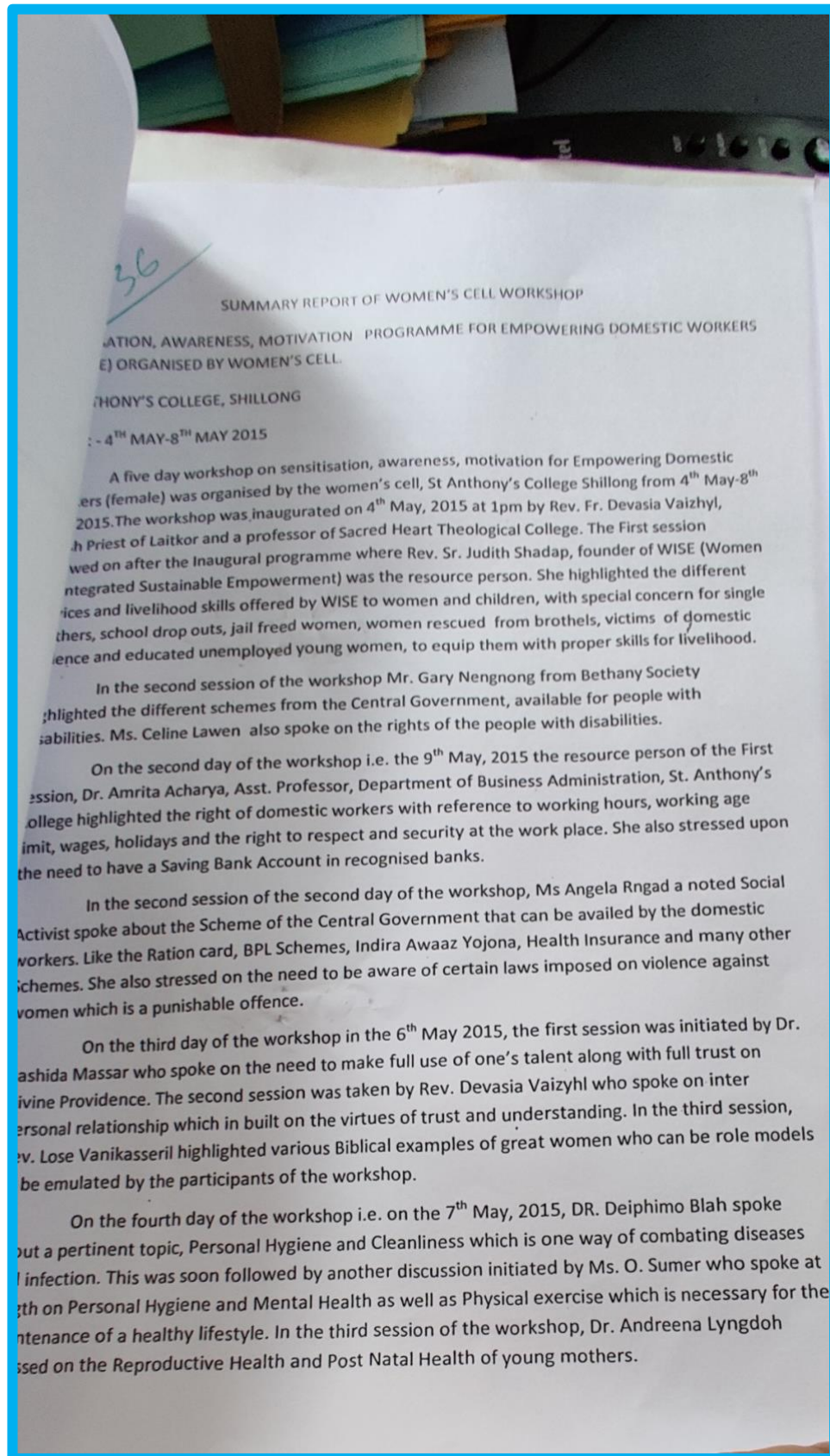





Creating Safe Spaces for Women in Educational Institutions

Theme: "Together We Can End GBV in Education!"

Objective:

To create and generate accountability in addressing issues of SHWWP (Sexual Harassment of Women in Workplace).

The 16 Days of Activism is a global campaign to raise awareness about violence against women and girls. The international campaign originated from the first Women's Global Leadership Institute coordinated by the Centre for Women's Global Leadership in 1991. The goal for 2017 is to continue to build awareness of and advocate for an end to all forms of gender-based violence in education once and for all, the theme being "Together We Can End Gender Based Violence in Education!"¹

A safe workplace is a woman's legal right as guaranteed by Articles 14, 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution (Development, 2015). The *Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act*, was passed in the year 2013, as a result of years long efforts on the Bhanwari Devi case in which a female employee of the State of Rajasthan was gang raped in the course of her work in preventing the practise of child marriage. Its success led to the recognition of sexual harassment at the workplace as a violation of women's fundamental right to equality by the Supreme Court of India, thus holding institutions accountable to uphold this right.

Sexual harassment has thus been defined as any one or more of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (whether directly or by implication), namely:

1. Physical contact or advances;
2. A demand or request for sexual favours;
3. Making sexually coloured remarks;
4. Showing pornography;
5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature (Development, 2015).

Sexual harassment is a silent form of abuse that meanders its way through social relations between men and women and even amongst women themselves. Meghalaya being a state composed of matrilineal societies of the Khasi, Jaintia and Garo, upholds a utopian myth of safety and empowerment of women. However, the dystopian reality is that crimes against women and children have been on the rise from 172 cases in 2007 to 398 in 2016². In the year


NEN has been observing the campaign every year where various issues related to women and girls/children in the State have been highlighted. 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ST. ANTHONY'S COLLEGE, WOMEN CELL CONCEPT NOTE OF A TWO – DAY SEMINAR ON AGING IN MEGHALAYA – CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

The 2011 census report showed that 8.6 % of the Indian Population was aged 60 years and above as against 5.6 % in 1961. This is also true of the population in the North East India, including the state of Meghalaya, which has witnessed a steady increase in the population of the aged. Therefore, this is a clear indication of the changing demographic profile of the country, and can also be considered as an indicator of the increasing life expectancy in the country. In fact, aging is a ‘natural process’ in all life forms, with its own specific demands from society and contributions to society.

However, the commonly accepted social norms of economic growth and success have resulted in aging being considered as an unacceptable part of human life. Therefore, the aged are viewed as a burden on others and a malaise for the society and their positive contribution to the society are completely ignored.

The need of the hour, is therefore, to bring about a paradigm shift in our attitude towards aging and adopting the concept of ‘positive aging’ as defined by the World Health




