#### THE ANNUAL QUALITY ASSURANCE REPORT (AQAR) OF THE IQAC

Name of the Institute: ST. ANTHONY'S COLLEGE Year of Report: October 2010 to September 2011

#### PART - A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

#### Infrastructure:

The college plan to go for leased line connectivity with a proper load balancer, To set up an intra-mail server for the use in the college. To build an E-platform for learning materials using Moodle. The computer science department is planning to make the facility of the computer lab available for the students of an evening school of the town. The students of the Cyber Club have agreed to guide these poor kids with the experience of learning the basics of computers, which otherwise they are not able to afford or have. New halogens spotlights for the video studio of the Media department were added. A flat screen television was purchased A 5.1 Dolby surround sound system was also purchased. A hi- end professional video camera for the Media department was purchased. This is to be used in the video studio. Sound software and Computer hardware was upgraded for the sound studio. LCD projectors were installed in most classrooms of the college.

#### Academics:

Computing and Robotics in collaboration with other institutes. In addition to the existing short term courses, we plan to start more courses on multimedia related programmes like, Maya, 3D Max and other Video related courses. We plan to start an orientation course in programming with Java, with view to helping the school students who find it difficult with programming concepts. Chemistry department propose to hold National Seminar on "Global Trends in Modern Chemistry" in December, 2010. Science departments plan of holding of regular students' Science Seminar. Field Trip programs to Institutes of National importance and Industries. All departments plan in organizing interdisciplinary Interaction Programs. Invitation to Guest Faculty. Organizing Popular Talks. Organizing Workshops/ Summer school for the students and to create awareness to the society particularly to the region. To initiate enriching personality development skills for the students making them employable.

#### Outcome achieved:

Computer Science department decided to make visits to Mother Theresa's home with students and faculty and spend some time and means with the less privileged. Other departments like Mass Media organized a Media workshop for two days on the topic "Citizen Journalism and New Media" in the month of May. A talk and presentation by a well established Photographer was organized for the students of the department in the month of June. A one day Photography workshop was conducted by the students of the department on World Photography Day for school students of the city and for the general public in the month of August. A three day photography

exhibition on the theme "Still Life" was conducted by the department in September. A lab journal and Mosaic was released in the College in September by the students of the Department. A stage play entitled "Ecstasy" was put up by the students of the department in the College Auditorium in the month of October meant for the general public. A one day trip to a local printing press in the city, as well as a tour to the Museum was conducted for the first year students of the department. A three day workshop on Personality Development Skills was arranged for the students of third year at Siloam in the month of July.

#### Part: B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Department. Every department is deeply committed to producing quality students each year, along with the college target of achieving 100 percent results. The teachers monitor the progress of students through periodic assessments such as terminal and Selection Examinations. Some departments also conduct continuous assessment through internal test(s) every month for all honors subjects and the other general subjects too. It is ensured that students are actively involved in project assignments and presentations, both at the group and individual level. The assessments are meant to allow the students to interact with real life situations (practice) and observe how various theories studied were/can be applied in reality. The teachers also provide feedbacks to the students to overcome their deficiencies as noticed by the teachers in the answers. The college has carried on its tradition of providing quality and market driven courses for the masses at affordable rates. Several short term courses were conducted by some department during the academic year. A national level conference IEEE 2nd National Conference in Emerging Trends in Computer Science and Application was organized by the Computer Science department in the month of March 2011 which saw huge participation from all across the country as well as outside.

A workshop on Embedded Systems was conducted by the department in collaboration with IIT Guwahati. In order to foster a healthy relationship with the students, a departmental picnic was organized for the students and the staff of most departments. Several globally recognized industry certification programs were offered to the students (both UG and PG) to give them an edge in the job market. With an aim of Providing Quality Computer Literacy to the general masses through the Cyber Club programmes. A one-day tutorial on Machine Translation was organized by the Computer department in March 2011. In the month of October 2011, the Cyber Club organized an interschool IT Quiz competition which saw participation from several schools of Shillong. A Nano chemistry Laboratory has been set up on 20th September, 2011, in technical collaboration with the Department of Chemical Sciences, Tezpur University. Khasi department along with the Department of Commerce and IQAC has successfully organized a two day Regional Seminar on Intellectual Property Rights in Khasi on the 28th -29th October 2010. A workshop on SPSS which was planned for the period under reference by Economics department will be held in November

# 21. Improvements in the library services:

# 25. Computerization of administration & the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates:

The administration, including the library and the process of admissions has been fully computerized with Wi-Fi Internet connection. The process of examinations has been partly computerized. The issue of certificates is done on printed formats.

# 26. Increase in infrastructural facilities;

- The interior arrangement of the staff room and class rooms are redesigned for maximum utility of space.
- The different departments got a laptop, a LCD projector and an OHP.
- The computer science department was upgraded with 40 new computers and a 10 KVA UPS. 43 new systems were bought for the staff and the students of MCA. Usage of systems, Scanning and Dot-matrix printing facilities were made available for free for the students in the Computer Centre.

 The existing facilities in the DBT, GOI, funded Green Chemistry Laboratory under star college scheme, augmented.

### 27. Technology upgradation:

- The Biotechnology and Biochemistry departments are equipped with Microscopes, PCR machines, Thermal Cycler, Cryocans, Gel Documentation System, ELISA reader, Spectrophotometer (UV-Vis)., Benchtop Fermenter Water Deionizer, CO<sub>2</sub> Incubator, Refrigerators. These are used for practical classes and dissertation projects.

A new I Mbps leased line connection was set up for the use of students.

 Computer department of the college has signed up for Microsoft Campus Agreement and for all the licensed versions of Adobe Products.

 The Internet machines in the library for students were fine-tuned and leased line connectivity was given better bandwidth.

The college has tie-up services with Nazareth Hospital, Dr. Gordon Robert Hospital, Shillong. The college also provides consultancy services to the hospital as well as other health centers in the state from time to time.

### 33. Performance in sports activities:

Students, teachers and technical staff participate in various sporting events during the annual College -Week celebrations, MCTA Inter- College sports meet, Varsity week sports for M. Sc. and other events; some get selected in the college teams of various sports. The college also has had state-level players in Football, Cricket, Table Tennis, Badminton and Basketball.

#### 35. Student achievements and awards.(e.g. attendance, etc.):

- Meritorious students have secured admissions to P.G. courses in recognized institutions. A
  few have been recruited by Industry and other educational institutions.
- This year saw most departments achieving 100% pass results in the NEHU exams. Most of the top rank holders in the University examination belonged to the college.
- Students have successfully emerged in entrance examinations of reputed institutions for different PG programmes. Token of appreciation in the form of certificates and medals were awarded to students in academics as well as in the different activities conducted by the departments and the college.

#### 36. Activities of the Guidance & Counseling unit :

- Life Orientation programmes aimed at developing the personality of the student were organized for all the degree students over a period of 3 days every year.
- Communication Skills Development programme was held for a period of 3 weeks. The
  focus of this programme was to hone the necessary skills that would be required by a
  student as they move on to the job scene or for higher studies.
- The Student Development Services organized a coaching programme for candidates aspiring to appear for the numerous Entrance Tests for MBA and M.Sc. in Biotechnology.
- There were a number of guest lectures and career talks held over the year on topics ranging from retail sector, insurance, Hospitality and Business Process Outsourcing.
- The SDS cell is involved in personal and academic counseling for different requirements of students.

The placement officer of the college SDS is in correspondence with various recruiters for holding campus interviews. A number of students were offered jobs by companies like Satyam Services Ltd, Wipro, IBM DAKSH, GENPACT, 7th Solutions, HSBC and Infosys.

10. The Institute plans to improve Multimedia Teaching Aids centre with laptops, LCD

projectors, Overhead projectors.

- 11. Through a full-time placement coordinator for help and assistance to enlighten our graduate and post graduate students in gaining employment to various reputed firms and institutions.
- 12. One of the institute's endeavors has always been to provide value education to students. In this regard, the institute will continue a holistic training centre known as SILOAM to impart relevant life skills to both student and teacher alike. Services rendered by SILOAM will also be available to the community at large.

13. The examination system will be fully computerized and also integrated with the students'

admission system for keeping and storing student data

o The Computer department is planning to organize a workshop on Spoken Tutorial with the help of IIT Mumbai in the coming year. This could be attended by the staff of the college and other institutes. The IEEE Conference being organized will be made into an International one in the year 2013. We plan to introduce the E-platform for course management deploying Moodle. Two of the faculty will see to the set up and management of the same. The department plans to study the possibility of introducing certifications in VMware, Postgres SQL etc. One of the faculties is looking into this area. We also plan to set up Intra mail server for the college. In addition to the existing short term courses, we

plan to start more courses on multimedia related programmes like, Maya, 3D Max and other Video related courses. The department is planning to make the facility of the computer lab available for the students of an evening school of the town. The students of the Cyber Club have agreed to guide these poor kids with the experience of learning the basics of computers, which otherwise they are not able to afford or have. We plan to start an orientation course in programming with Java, with view to helping the school students who find it difficult with programming concepts. Department decided to make visits to the SOS village or to the Mother Theresa's home with students and faculty and spend some time and means with the less privileged.
